I apologize for the delay in responding to your correspondence, but our office is dealing with a backlog of requests as we continue to manage the Department's Clemency Initiative. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552 *et seq.*, you requested any and all documents related to a petition for any form of executive clemency for Juvenal Ovidio Ricardo Palmera Pineda, also known as "Simon Trinidad".
